# FROM THE LEADERSHIP TEAM

Looking back on the 2021-22 school year, I know that this year brought many positive changes with the easing of pandemic restrictions. We are proud that so much was achieved by our students and graduates.

The 2022 eighth grade class of St. Teresa of Calcutta, consisting of 17 students, received their diplomas and awards, and have moved on to area high schools to continue their education. We celebrate their accomplishments with joy and gratitude! These students join the network of 133 Nativity Preparatory Academy Alumni that are continuing their journey in high school, college, or the workforce.

I am happy to announce that we are now in our 14th year! We are proud to share that our model of middle school education

with graduate support is helping students to excel and graduate. Our daily school attendance rate is 95% and 65% of our students achieved honor roll in the 2021-2022 school year. After completing their education at Nativity, 97% of our alumni have graduated from high school, 79% have 2- or 4-year college degrees, and 15% are enrolled in trade schools or the military.

The efforts of so many students, teachers, families, and volunteers, along with your support, have created the results as our students thrive in a safe and supportive environment. Because of partners like you, our donor-funded and tuition-free model creates a pathway for under-resourced families in the Rochester region to actualize their full potential. Our students and graduates are exploring their passions, finding their purpose, and using their unique strengths to bring light into this world. You make this mission a reality!

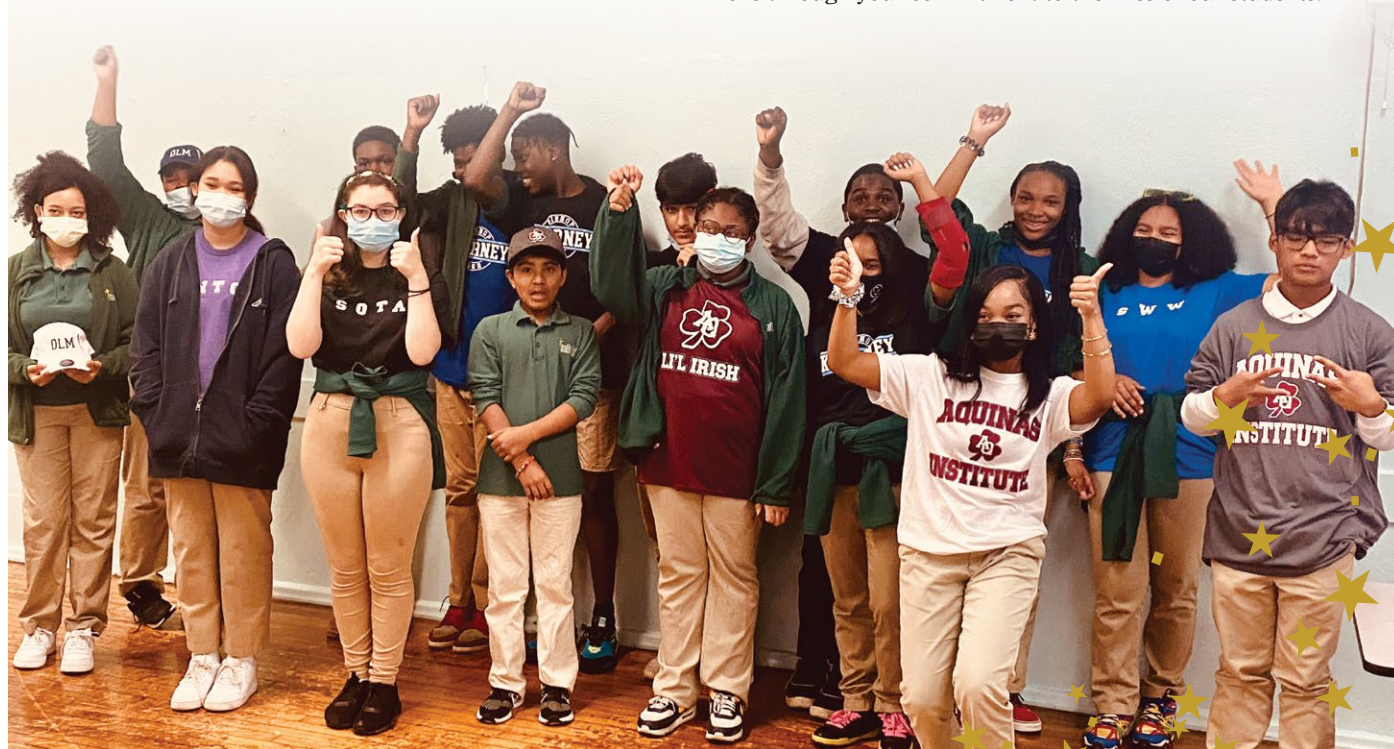

Nativity Preparatory Academy is Rochester, New York's only tuition-free private middle school serving students of all faiths in grades 5-8 in the Catholic tradition. Nativity is dedicated to transforming the lives of underserved students through an education that provides strong academic grounding coupled with a sense of spirituality, morality, and personal responsibility.

Within a secure and nurturing environment, we deliver a uniquely effective education through an extended school day and school year, dedicated and caring teachers, personal mentoring, and continuing support after graduation.

Nativity was founded in 2009, with the first class of eighth grade students graduating in 2012. The school is jointly sponsored by McQuaid Jesuit and the Sisters of St. Joseph of Rochester.

# Graduate Support Program Updates

What a year it has been in Graduate Support! Continuing our trend of diverse high school placement following a best-fit model, this past June we graduated 17 scholars who will be embarking this fall on the next chapter of their educational journey at ten different high schools.

Students will be attending traditional public schools, magnet schools, charter schools, and of course, all four of our wonderful Catholic partner high schools. Each of these 17 students is prepared and excited for all that lies ahead of them as they transition into high school, and we are looking forward to following all of their successes yet to come.

As we celebrate and recognize the accomplishments of our most recent graduates, we also look to the trailblazing paths being taken by graduates at all stages of their academic careers, and the role of the Graduate Support Program in the continuing success of our alumni. For the first time, this fall Nativity will have the same number of graduates in our high school Graduate Support Program as in our middle school program on site, with 63 high school students! Additionally, we will continue to support our graduates in college and the workforce, with academic support, financial aid navigation, course selection, and community events open to all 133 of our graduates.

This past academic year, Nativity graduates participated in many activities through our programming, including academic tutoring, social activities, service projects, and mentoring, with over 90% of graduates in high school participating in some form of programming with us, and nearly a dozen graduates in college or career returning for programming and events. Graduates in high school served as tour guides for 8th grade visit days, assisted with middle school tutoring and enrichment, volunteered as needed, attended Saturday Breakfast Club to receive academic support, came to our Alumni Holiday Party and came by just to hang out this past year! Creating a culture where our graduates feel comfortable at Nativity, and choose to remain engaged in our community has been my vision for the Graduate Support Program, and coming off of the challenges of remote programming it has been reinvigorating to have alumni

engaging with us in many meaningful ways. Through the continued support of Nativity and the Graduate Support Program, I have seen the program grow to include a comprehensive menu of programs, resources, and opportunities for students and families and truly believe this is the difference maker for our students.

In addition to growth in events and programs, our tuition support program has grown significantly to ensure students have equitable access to the best-fit high school for their educational needs and their family goals. Last academic year Nativity supported 10 students attending Aquinas and Mercy, totaling \$20,000 of direct financial assistance. This coming year, we will support 16 students with \$35,000, rounding out a four-year phase-in of the tuition support program. Additionally, Nativity continues to assist graduates with items ranging from backpacks and uniforms to books and school supplies, ensuring students have all that they need for successful high school completion. All 63 of our high school students for this coming year are on track to graduate on time, a testament to the program's positive impact.

Nativity alumni's high school graduation rate continues to be over 97% year after year, and our college persistence rate remains over twice the national and local average for similar populations. Thanks in large part to the mission of educational excellence fostered at Nativity and the support received throughout high school, our graduates have gone on to attend private and public four-year colleges, two-year colleges and vocational programs.

All of our students are capable of success at the highest levels, and with support, resources, and mentoring, will soon become our community's leaders. I would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to all who have been a part of the Graduate Support Program and its continued success this year, particularly the Graduate Support Committee, high school administrators and counselors, community partners, donors, and mentors. Thank you for trusting me to continue the mission of this program, and for encouraging all of our students to continue on their own unique paths to success!

# Student Support: School Year Reflection

Dipendra Bharati (McQuaid 2021) and Manisha Giri (Mercy 2021) spoke at our Annual Billy D Golf Tournament, highlighting the Graduate Support Program and its impact on their high school and college trajectories. Dipendra is a 2nd year student at Monroe Community College, studying engineering with intent to transfer to Rochester Institute of Technology or the University of Rochester following his MCC graduation this coming spring. Manisha will also be attending Monroe Community College this fall, transferring from Canisius College to be closer to home and to help her family. She will continue to study business at MCC, with the hope to transfer to St. John Fisher or SUNY Brockport following her MCC graduation. Both of these alumni shared with the attendees at the Billy D Golf Tournament the positive impact they have felt from the support they have received from Nativity, both directly in the form of tutoring, mentorship, and college counseling, but also indirectly through connections and high school placement that enabled them to attend and graduate from prestigious high schools that have set them up for lifelong success. Both Dipendra and Manisha remain actively involved in Nativity's Graduate Support Program more than a year after high school graduation, attending events, volunteering, and even offering to lead enrichment programming for Nativity's after-school program! We are so proud of them, and all of our alums, and congratulate them for continuing their education into college with perseverance and commitment to excellence each step of the way!



As a new member of the faculty at Nativity, I have felt incredibly grateful to spend my days here and a sense of love and togetherness present in our school. The message of “family” echoes in a lot of the interactions we have daily, and I have come to know and understand our students and the tremendous hearts they each carry.

This past school year, I taught Social Emotional Learning to our students individually and in small groups. A lot of time was spent navigating many difficult aspects tied to being a middle school aged kid in today's world. There were countless moments of individual growth for students, moments of excitement, understanding, relating, and healing. Towards the end of the year, our students were leading discussions on tough topics related to self-awareness and recognizing the feelings and perspectives of others. They were able to communicate and ask for what they needed. They supported their peers with encouragement, advice, gratitude, and respect. All these interactions reminded me of our strong commitment to student wellness and the importance of taking care of one another, like a family.

In my role as a counselor and social worker, I have the privilege to sit one on one with many of our students and create a safe place for them to share what is going on in their individual lives. There are students that meet with me on a daily, weekly, and monthly basis. For some students, the idea that I am available to assist in any capacity to help provide support is enough. I provide counseling sessions that delve into many different topics, connecting students and families to resources in our community, and communicating to our teachers and staff members the best way to approach a student's learning. These are all important aspects of our school's success. If we encompass our students with care and compassion by focusing on the whole child, we will offer them the best path for growth and success. It is essential to our students that we continue to prioritize their mental and emotional well-being alongside academics.

I am incredibly proud of the work our Nativity students have done this past year, not only academically but also emotionally. I am also grateful for the ways that each part of our community takes care of one another. There is something special about the way our Nativity family supports each member. This past year was difficult in many ways, but also full of so many bright moments with our students and staff. I am proud of the students for the ways that they overcame obstacles and hard days. I am proud of the students for the joy that they share with us. I reflect also that this work is possible because of the incredible support from donors, volunteers, and Board of Trustees members of Nativity Preparatory Academy.

Donations to our Student Sponsorship Program ensure that we can continue to educate our students for the four years they are enrolled at Nativity. Sponsorship of our students supports our mission of educational equity by providing the financial support for students to attend Nativity tuition-free.

The cost of educating one student is \$14,500 per year, but we are a tuition-free school. All that we ask of student families is a \$250 activity fee per year. A Nativity education is funded almost entirely by private donors.

# Extended Day Programming

During the academic year 2021–2022, after reducing it at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, Nativity Preparatory Academy reinitiated its extended day programming using a model of community and guardian engagement. We accomplished a lot! In any given month, volunteer and staff members collectively gave over 200 hours of service to Nativity. We partnered with 175 volunteers and 69 partner organizations to offer tutoring support to students and 27 different enrichment activities. Throughout the year after the academic day was completed, students went on field trips and collaborated with local businesses to learn about the happenings outside of the school walls and to be engaged in the community through service.

Our school year was filled with joyful learning moments. The small size of our school enabled staff and volunteers to focus on building relationships, and they embraced the opportunity. Along with all else Nativity offers, the Extended Day Program gives its students chances to explore, interact with those outside their communities, and engage their own energy and talents.

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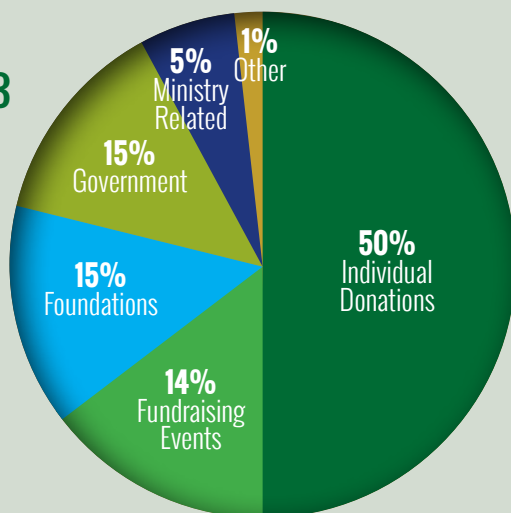
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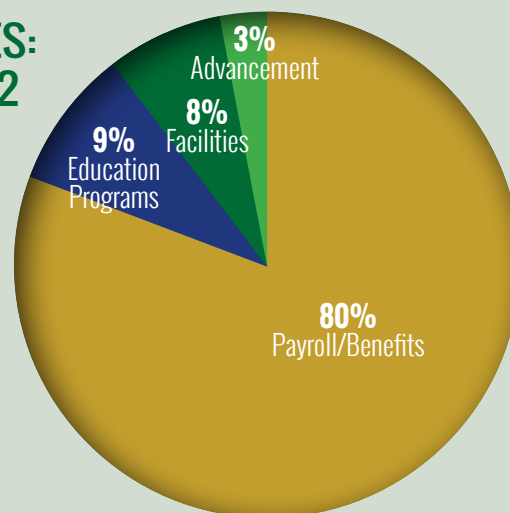
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
