Graduate Support Program Updates

The 2022-2023 school year was another great year for Nativity and our high school placement program, thanks to the many families, partners, and advocates who work to ensure best-fit placement for our scholars each year. In June we graduated 15 students who are now beginning their high school careers at schools around Rochester and beyond. Students will be attending all four of our Catholic partner high schools, as well as independent private schools and charter schools. Each of these students worked diligently throughout their 8th grade year to be prepared for all that lies ahead in this next chapter, and we are excited to continue to witness their greatness shine through as they become important members of their high school communities!

In addition to our middle school graduates, 16 Nativity alumni graduated from high school this June, a 100% graduation rate for the Class of 2019! Students from the Class of 2019 will be attending four-year colleges, two-year colleges, and technical programs this coming school year, with 14 of them immediately entering some form of higher education. Our college-going and college-persistence rates continue to be well above the national average for similar populations, demonstrating our students' abilities to achieve at the highest levels.

As our alumni base continues to grow, so too do our partnerships with community partners and our supports for graduates. During the last school year, Nativity graduates were able to participate in many types of Graduate Support programming with us including:

- Academic tutoring
- Service projects
- Mentoring
- Community events

Nativity continues to be a place of community for our alumni, with graduates coming back frequently for anything from help with chemistry homework to just visiting teachers and friends. This open-door policy has helped to maintain relationships with alumni so that we can better anticipate needs and provide resources, and is a key driver of our success with Graduate Support. Over the last few years Nativity's menu of supports for graduates has evolved to be comprehensive and holistic, with plans for even more programming around career planning, professional mentorship, and financial literacy in the works, thanks to growing partnerships.

Beyond our programmatic offerings, Nativity continues to meaningfully support our graduates and their families through our Tuition Support Program. Last year Nativity committed over \$30,000 in direct tuition assistance to students attending Our Lady of Mercy and The Aquinas Institute. This year we will support students attending Our Lady of Mercy, The Aquinas Institute, Bishop Kearney, and Hope Hall. The Tuition Support Program enables families to select the best-fit high school for their student with an understanding that Nativity will work with each family to close the gap between school-based aid and a family's ability to pay.

All of Nativity's students and alumni are exceptional scholars with great academic potential. With support, resources, and mentoring these young adults will soon become community leaders. It is a joy to watch each of them learn and grow from middle school through high school and beyond. Thank you to all who have been a part of the Graduate Support Program and its success this year!

Nativity Preparatory Academy of Rochester is a Catholic middle school, serving students of all faiths, dedicated to educational equity that transforms the lives of underserved students. We are uniquely positioned to deliver a high-quality education to students from underserved and overlooked communities in the City of Rochester. When a student enrolls in 5th grade at Nativity, they have a great ability to learn, but have been underserved in their education prior to enrollment. At no tuition cost to families, Nativity's educational program is designed to empower under-resourced youth in our community to be supported in education for grades 5-8, the high school years that follow, into college, and beyond.

Donations to our Student Sponsorship Program ensure that we can continue to educate our students for the four years they are enrolled at Nativity. When you join the program your four-year commitment makes the journey of a student's education possible. Sponsorship of our students supports our mission of educational equity by providing the financial support for students to attend Nativity tuition-free.

The cost of educating one student is \$14,500 per year, but we are a tuition-free school. All that we ask of student families is a \$250 activity fee per year. A Nativity education is funded almost entirely by private donors.

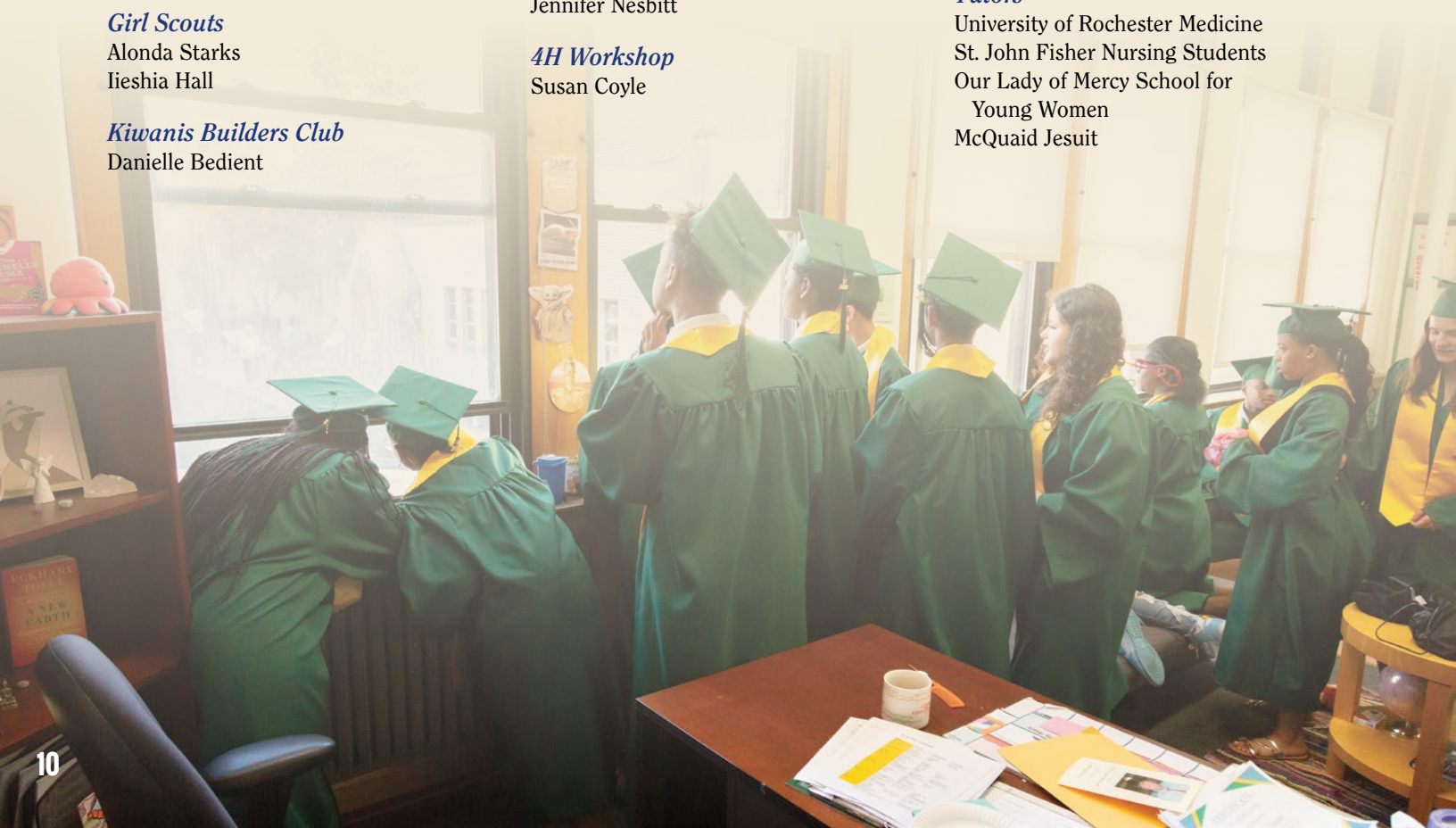

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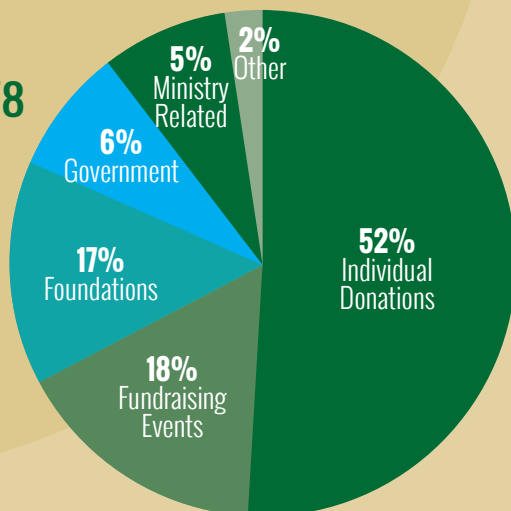
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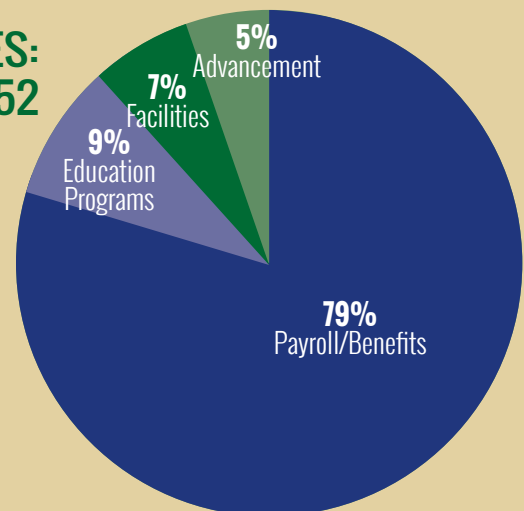
